

Sunday, Jan. 12 (after service in Centennial Hall) **Russ Melby** will facilitate a Voyagers Adult Forum on January 12 based on a 3-page



article titled "Catholic Zionism," as reprinted from the January 2020 "First Things Journal." The essay is written by Gavin D'Costa, the author, most recently, of Catholic Doctrines on the Jewish People after Vatican II. Mr. D'Costa is persuaded that "the Jewish state [is] a sign of God's fidelity." Copies of the article will be provided. A "bonus" one-page article titled "A Rabbi Walks into a Presbyterian Church" will be distributed at the end of the January 12 forum.


